University of Pécs

History of University:

1367 The Anjou king Louis the Great establishes Hungary's first university in Pécs.

15th century Instead of the university there are two separate colleges, one for divinity and one for law studies.

1785 Emperor Joseph II orders to transfer the Royal Academy from Győr to Pécs.

1802 The Royal Academy is moved back to its original location.

1833 Bishop Ignác Szepesy, in co-operation with the town council, establishes the Academy of Pécs with two faculties (law and arts).

1921 The Hungarian National Assembly passes a Bill that transfers the Hungarian Royal Erzsébet University founded in Pozsony (Bratislava) (temporarily) to Pécs.

1923 - 1939 The Erzsébet University proves to be a dynamic and outstanding spiritual workshop, offering courses in law, medicine, humanities and theology.

1941 The Faculty of Humanities is partly moved to Szeged, partly to Kolozsvár.

1951 The medical school becomes an independent institution (Medical University of Pécs) – the University of Pécs is left with only one faculty for law studies.

1966 The so-called 400-bed clinical unit is opened, housing five different clinics (internal medicine, orthopaedics, radiology, surgery, ophthalmology).

1973 - 1974 The training of dentists is launched.

1975 The Faculty of Economics is established, earlier operating as an Affiliated Section of Karl Marx University of Economics in Budapest.

1982 The Teacher Training College of Pécs is merged with the Faculty of Economics and the Faculty of Law. The new institution assumes the name Janus Pannonius University of Pécs.

1990 A Faculty of Health Sciences is established at the Medical University of Pécs that launches four new majors in its first year in four different cities.

1992 The Teacher Training College is split into the Faculty of Humanities and the Faculty of Sciences, the University has now four independent faculties.

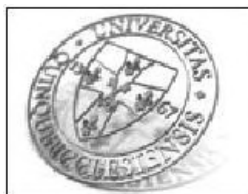
1995 The Pollack Mihály Technical College is integrated into Janus Pannonius University.

1996 The Faculty of Music and Visual Arts is established as the sixth faculty of the University.

2000 With the merger of Janus Pannonius University, the Medical University of Pécs and the Illyés Gyula Teacher Training College of Szekszárd an integrated university is founded under the name The University of Pécs.

2004 The Pollack Mihály College of Engineering is granted the University Faculty status.

2005 The tenth Faculty of the University of Pécs comes into being under the name of Faculty of Adult Education and Human Resource Development.



Transport

From Budapest Airport to City

Terminal 1

Rail link between Ferihegy Terminal 1 and Budapest - Nyugati Railway Station

Fare: 300HUF

Journey time: 22-25 minutes

Ticket can be purchased:

At the airport: at the Tourism Office of Budapest at Terminal 1 from 9.00 till 22.00, and from the conductor on the train outside of opening hours.

Off airport: ticket offices and machines.



Terminal 2

By metro and bus Budapest Airport is relatively well accessible also by Public Transportation Means. Passengers are taken by a direct bus service from Terminals 1 and 2, called the Bus 200 to Kőbánya-Kispest metro terminal. It operates more frequently; and it operates for longer hours providing a link between the city and the airport even after midnight and at early dawn. By the 'blue' (3) Metro you can reach Deák Ferenc Square in the City in 20 minutes. Public Transportation Means can be used for a fare: the one-way through-ticket costs HUF 280 [300 HUF when buying on the bus from the driver]. 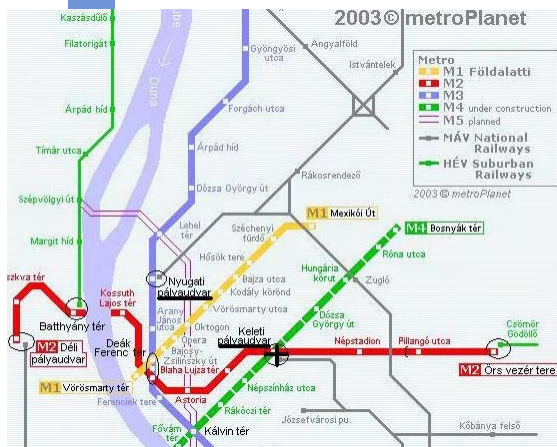

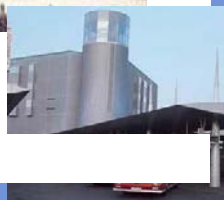


By train from Budapest to Pécs

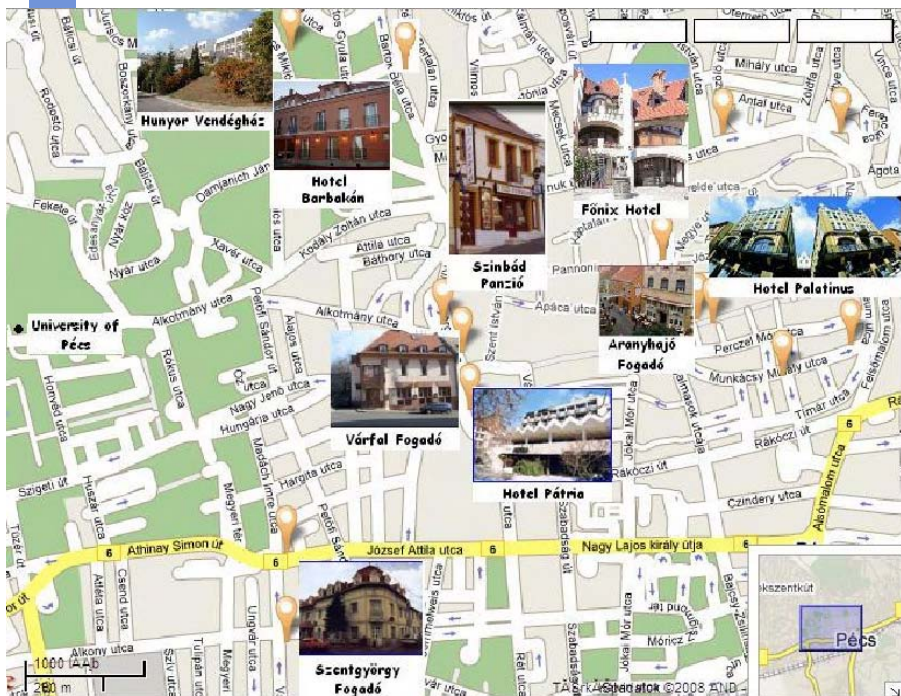

About Pécs

Pécs – a two thousand year-old city at the beginning of the third millennium

Pécs, the fifth largest city of Hungary, lies in the southern part of Transdanubia and is the seat of Baranya County. It is the largest city of the western region of the country, a gateway to Croatia, the Balkans and the North-Italian region. Mysterious Roman crypts, domed Turkish mosques and a slender minaret, fine Zsolnay porcelain, grand Csontváry paintings, decorative Vasarely patterns, almonds trees in full blossom early spring, pleasant restaurants and cafés, - this is all Pécs, a 2000 year-old city at the foot of the Mecsek hills with a Mediterranean climate and atmosphere. The vicinity of the Adriatic Sea, the zigzagging streets of the historic center, the teeming life in the early summer evening all evoke the feeling of a Mediterranean region.

Pécs, called Sopianae in the Roman era, was a significant center of early Christianity. The "necropolis" consisting of 16 graves is a unique monument complex that was recognized by UNESCO as World Heritage in 2000. At the same time Pécs is the city of grapes and good wine. One of the first champagne companies was established here, and wine-making is still a living tradition in the area. The city is also renowned for its rich artistic life and multi-colored festivals. Several universities, research institutions, and significant scientific and professional achievements enhance the reputation of Pécs the world over. Lively students have also found a worthy home among the walls of the city. The settlement of German, Croatian and Serb communities has resulted in an interesting mixture of population in the course of the past few centuries. In 1998 the city was awarded the Peace Prize of UNESCO. In addition to being a cultural, educational and administrative center of the region and the most significant employer in Baranya County, Pécs is also an industrial base that is always ready to adopt modern technologies, functioning as a natural gravitational center in the region. With the chief consulate of the Republic of Croatia and honorary consulates of Austria, France, Great Britain, Germany and Italy, the city is also an important diplomatic center.

Innovation and creativity – the city of knowledge

The high level of education is extremely favorable for economic development, for 40% of the population over 18 years has at least secondary school education and 15% of the population over 25 years of age has a university degree. The number of people speaking foreign languages is double the national average, for 19% of the population of Pécs speaks a foreign language. For many centuries Pécs has been a city of students and the scientific and higher educational center of Transdanubia.

In addition to the university research centers there are three independent research institutes in the city: the Regional Research Centre of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, the Research Institute of Viticulture and the Experimental Institute of Dairy Farming.

The city is strongly committed to developing its wide-ranging international relations and twin city agreements (Fellbach, Graz, Osijek, Cluj, Kütahya, Lahti, Seattle, Terracina, Tuscon, Tuzla, Lyon).

The Cultural Capital of Europe 2010

Pécs has won the title of Cultural Capital of Europe for the year 2010. This title was given to Pécs by the European Council in 2005.

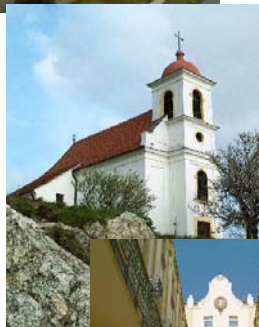
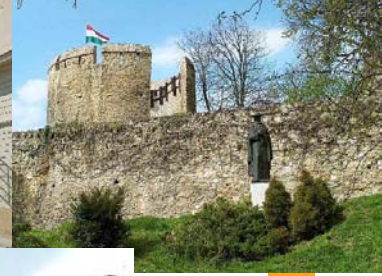
